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2. Syllabus Introduction

Welcome to the Story of Disease 1 Module. We will:

- Be engaged in a "process-centered" approach to Ayurvedic Pathology. We will concentrate on therapeutic objectives and actions, as well as study of diet and lifestyle as they pertain to pathology.
- Discuss case strategy and therapy overview, individual treatments, and actions from an Ayurvedic perspective.
- Discuss several approaches to a case and to the use or appropriateness of any specific treatment, based on several approaches to pathology, including overview of prakruti, vikruti and disease.

3. Course Overview

Course Description

Story of Disease is a section of the Ayurvedic professional course. We will discuss Pathology from a basic perspective, and focus on the role of Pathology in the current American lifestyle.

- Proficiency and confidence in knowledge of pathology and Ayurvedic Pathology techniques and applications
- Deeper understanding of the concepts of Ayurvedic therapeutic procedures, including how it can be applied to health maintenance, acute and chronic conditions, compliance and efficacy

- This module (online only) is a combination of lecture, discussion and case review. The module will have several subsections. Each subsection will review a Pathology topic.
- At the end of the module, there will be a comprehensive exam, covering a reasonable overview of the material. The exam will <u>primarily focus on information from class lecture</u> <u>and discussion</u>. The participant should take comprehensive class notes. Much of the class lecture information may be repeated in additional readings provided by the instructor.
- Examples of class topics or visual aids will occasionally be available for viewing.
